
Markey Pulling Away from Kennedy in MA Senate Primary

In a new poll of likely voters in Massachusetttscoming September 1 primary election Incumbent U.S. Senator Ed Markey has opened up a commanding lead over his challenger, U Representative Joe Kennedy, III. Markeynet sitting Massachusetts Senator who first took office in 2013 during a special election to replace then Senator John Kerry, now lead Repdy, 52% to 40%. The pollonducted by the UMass Lowell Center for Public Opinionas fielded from August 1321 and carries a margin of error of 4.1%

Theresult marks a significant 14 oint shift in the race. In the previous UMass Lowell poll released on May 7, 2020, Kennedy and Markey appetar be locked in a tight racewith Kennedy at 44% and Markey at 42%.

By far the biggest split in this race is voters by education. Among those with a college degree, Markey is ahead by 37 points, 652%, while Kennedy leads among those without a college degree by 15 points, 53% to 38%.

Markeyis also particularly strong among young voters, womemites, and those with a family income of more than \$100,000 per year. Among voters 4,8 Markey leads Kennedy 52, while he enjoys a more modest lead, 49, among those 45 and older. Likewise, among



57% to 33%, while Markey and Kennedy are tied at 46% among those who make less than \$50,000 per year. And, among the voters, Markey leads by 16 points, 55% to Kennedy's 39%, but Kennedy is upne point, 41% to Markey's 40% among nothite voters.

The campaign, which has turnedrimonious for a primary
