

- Likely Voter Criterion: Voters are included in the frame aftpassing abehavioralscreen basedon vote intention.Variables measuring ast primary behavior, strength of vote intention, and reported attention to the campaignare then used to weight the data with those reporting greater attention, more frequent past behavior, and a greater certainty of voting receiving greater weight in the final model disposition.
