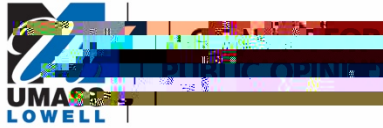
Margin of Error: +/-4.1%(adjusted for design effects)

Survey Mode: Online, webbased survey, self-administered

Sampling Method: YouGov interviewed 847 eligible respondents, who were then matched down to a sample of 800 to produce the final dataset. The respondents were matched to a sampling frame on gender, age, race, and education based on known characteristics of Democratic Party primary voters from the Massachusetts voter

voters from the Massachusetts voter file to produce the final weight.

**Likely Voter Criterion:** Voters are included in the frame after passing a behavioral screen based on vote intention. Variables measuring past primary behavior, strength of vote intention, and reported attention to the campaign are then used to weight the data with those reporting greater attention, more frequent past behavior, and a greater certainty of voting receiving greater weight in the final model disposition.
