Dan Koh Leads a Field of 10 Candidates out of 10 Voters Still Undecided

UMass Lowell and the Boston Globe have partnered to release the nonpartisan
poll in the Massachusetts Congressional District race to succeed outgoing incumbent Niki

among likely voters. Majorities say they have never heard of Goldner (59%), Das (56%), Ballinger (55%), and Ballinger (55%). Majorities of Massachusetts District 3 likely Democratic primary voters have no opinion or have never heard of 9 of the 10 candidates running for the office. The exception, again, is Koh

This is not for the lack of campaign efforts. Nearly half of the likely Democratic primary voters surveyed (48%) indicated they had been contacted by phone by one of the campaigns and nearly a third (30%) indicated that they had been contacted in person by the campaigns. reason Dan Koh is the known candidate in the district is that according to the data available to us, he uncovered the most ground with his campaign operation. This is a feat that we should perhaps not find all that surprising given his sizable campaign war chest advantage vis the other candidates.
